What is it?

- Agree to pray for each other and Westminster daily for 30 days.
- After 30 days each of you can find another person to enter a prayer covenant. In time it will grow across our church.

Why do it?

- Lifting each other up in prayer is a wonderful and supportive ministry to each other.
- We grow in our individual relationship with God as we pray for others.
- We grow in our corporate relationship with God as more and more in our congregation are praying for Westminster.

How is it done?

- Pray one of the suggested prayers below...
- Or, pray for each other’s specific requests
- Check in with your prayer partner weekly to see how they are doing and for what they might want prayer.

Suggested prayers:

- Lord, grant _____ and me the grace today to commit our lives to the Lordship of Jesus Christ without reservation, and grant _____ and me further the grace to know your strength and your guidance this day. Amen.
- Or Ephesians 3:16–19
For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches He may strengthen _____ and me with power through his Spirit in our inner being, so that Christ may dwell in our hearts through faith. And I pray that _____ and I, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge – that we may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.
