

Peace Be With You

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." (John 14:27)

"Peace be with you," we say while greeting one another in worship. "Peace," is how I sign most of my emails. But peace is so much more than a polite phrase or a simple wish.

We live in a world where peace often feels fragile or inaccessible. We continue to be shaken by the devastation and violence in Gaza. As horrific images appear on the news, I resist my desire to hide in my own peace, to look away and pretend it isn't happening. Peace feels hard to imagine. The school year had just barely begun when another school shooting, this time in Minneapolis, reminded us of the fear so many students live with every day. Peace feels urgent. We've felt the tearing apart of community through political rhetoric steeped in anger, suspicion, and distrust. Peace feels countercultural. In it all, our faith constantly points us back to the power and presence of peace through Christ. Peace when it feels impossible. Peace despite the odds.

In worship this September, we will once again enter the Season of Peace, a time of reflection, prayer, and practice leading up to World Communion Sunday on October 5. Each week, we'll consider a different aspect of peace: the peace that calms our restless hearts, the peace that heals relationships, and the peace that reaches across borders and divisions to embrace the whole world. Along the way, we'll notice the many layers of nuance and challenge that come with living as peacemakers.

As I've been planning, I've had the song lyric running through my mind, "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me." It's a simple line, but a strong invitation. Peace does not only come from powerful lawmakers, global treaties, or heroic changemakers. Often, it begins with our daily choices, with the ways we speak to one another, with the way we listen, with the way we trust God to lead us with wisdom and grace.

We may be mere individuals, one small congregation. But together, bound in God's love, our witness matters. When we extend forgiveness, when we choose gentleness, when we pray for enemies and seek justice for the vulnerable, we participate in the peace Christ gives and the world so desperately needs.

So as we pass the peace each Sunday, may it be more than a familiar ritual. May it be a reminder of who we are: a community called to embody Christ's peace in our own hearts, in our relationships, and in the wide world God calls us to love.

Boiler and Roof Campaign_

Westminster is currently undertaking two major capital improvement projects. These include replacing the boilers for the sanctuary and replacing the roof on the original building. The existing boilers were installed in 1996, and the roof was last replaced in 1990. These efforts will keep the sanctuary and offices warm in the winter and prevent leaks and further damage to the original building roof. The cost of these projects is approximately \$130,000, which is more than the funds we have readily available to pay for these projects. We are seeking additional donations from the congregation to help
