Boiler and Roof Campaign: A special "boiler and roof campaign" has been established to defray the cost of two major capital improvement projects: replacement of the boilers that heat the sanctuary, offices and associated basement areas, and replacement of the roof over the original wing of the building. These projects will cost \$130,000, which is greater than our capital obsolescence savings. Both projects need to be implemented this year.
